WAYS TO REDUCE CARBON FOOTPRINT:

Take fewer or no flights. Air travel contributes almost a quarter of the average person's annual emissions. Take a train if possible.

Eat less meat, particularly beef and lamb. Cows and sheep emit large quantities of methane, a powerful Global Warming gas. A vegan diet can cut emissions from food. Repair and Reuse – keep appliances in operation longer can reduce the burden on scarce resources and help avoid waste.

Switch to low energy lighting, LED lights have become much cheaper and less power than halogen lights.

Consume less – simply buying less stuff is a good route to a smaller carbon footprint.

The fashion industry is one the biggest contributors to greenhouse emissions.

Make sure home appliances are energy efficient. Reduce the use of washing machines, tumblers and dishwashers. Improve the efficiency of heating or cooling your home by switching on to the renewable resources.

Last but not the least, reduce journeys, use bicycle, or go by walk for shorter distances.






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STAND ALONE LESSONS - CLIMATE CHANGE
